

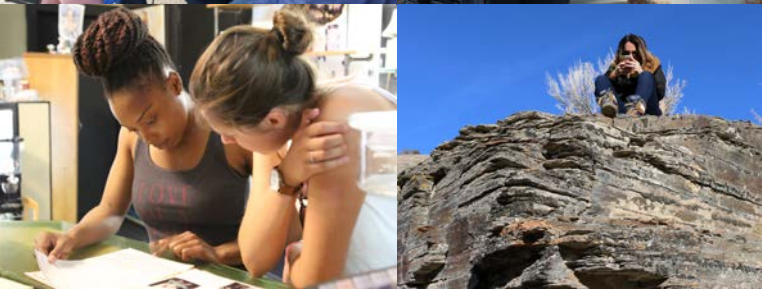


SAMUEL PROCTOR ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM INTERNSHIP IN SOCIAL JUSTICE
