



Students in this course will create a live performance from oral history interviews.



Students will travel in October to the **Imagining America Conference** at the **University of California, Davis** to present an original performance highlighting UF's documentation of the 2017 Women's March on Washington. In the second half of the internship, students will conduct and process oral history interviews, and use that material to create podcasts or short documentaries.
